Dr. Mark Welshimer serves as the Pastor of Magnolia UMC, a growing suburb on the northwest side of Houston, Texas. He is a native Texan from El Paso. At an early age he made a faith decision and then committed membership to The United Methodist Church through the Wesley Foundation at Texas Tech University, while earning his BBA. He received his calling into the ministry serving as a summer camp counselor at Sky Ranch Camp in Van, Texas.
